Our Aims and Objects

- (a) To maintain libraries, reading rooms and clubs etc. for the benefit and use of the members of the association.
- (b) To educate adult deaf and/or dumb members of the Association by providing night classes or any other manner, convenient for the association.
- (c) To provide or get provided primary and higher education for the poor deaf and/or dumb and to arrange for technical, engineering or handicraft education for them as far as practicable and subject to the availability of funds.
- (d) To look after and to protect the interests of the poor, needy and orphan deaf and dumb in general by educating them, by finding out jobs for educated or knowing Hindi deaf and/or dumb or providing small scale workshop for those who know handicraft or by getting some seats reserved for them in State Services.
- (e) To provide up-to-date medical help for the treatment and cure of deafness and dumbness and to try to get free hearing aids for the poor deaf who can hear with the help of hearing aids.
- (f) To provide amenities for the recreation and amusement of the members of the association i.e. to provide with games-outdoor and indoor, to hold meeting etc. to arrange other things necessary for the improvement of the health and brain of the members.
- (g) To construct a building, which shall be the property of the association, for office purpose of the association and for the recreation of the members, and where association can carry on its different types of activities smoothly.
- (h) To propagate by means of press, posters, advertisements and other means, the cause of deaf and dumb and make known to the government and the public the backward and appalling conditions of the deaf and dumb and solicit for their help and sympathy.
- (i) To organise from time to time study circles from among the members for the diffusion of the useful knowledge concerning politics, civic duties and other current affairs.

REPORT

Guests, Brothers and Sisters,

I am most happy to welcome you to the 26th Anniversary of our Association and express our grateful thanks for your kind presence here today.

I find it my most pleasant duty to present before you the 26th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts of the Association. You will find that we have endeavoured to the best of our ability to coordinate, consolidate and to enlarge the field of our activities concerning the welfare and well being of the deaf of the Union Territory of Delhi. We have been successful to some extent, but we wished for greater success as our sole concern is to rehabilitate each and every deaf of Delhi and to make them happy, forgetting the shortcomings in life due to their handicap like other normal people. To achieve this aim, we have now embarked upon a three points programme, which are (i) Employment to all Deaf of Delhi. (ii) Recreational Facilities for all members and (iii) Social Adjustment. We stand committed to help in all possible manners to concerned persons.

Silver Jubilee of the Foundation of our Association was celebrated last year. The Celebration will be vivid in our memory for many a year to come. We had a well chalked out programme for the celebration which included :-Cricket Tournament, 7th Delhi Games of the Deaf, Seminar on Deafness, Exhibition, Drama, Mime and Felicitation to Founder Members, Outstanding members and workers. The first two programmes were postponed due to heavy rains. The seminar was held as per schedule on 3.10.75 under the chairmanship of Smt. Habiba Kidwai, Chairman, Delhi Social Welfare Advisory Board. Problems of the deaf were discussed in the seminar. Eight selected papers concerning every aspect of life were considered and discussed at length. Its main recommendation was proper utilization of the ability of the deaf in 'National Building'.

In the evening of the same day our sister organisation, Delhi Foundation of Deaf Women presented their masterpiece silent play "I TOO AM A GIRL" which received wide acclamation from the audience and was subsequently telecasted from Delhi Television Station. Most salient feature of the play however was that it was written, directed and enacted by all deaf artists. I thank the artists and members of the Foundation.

The Exhibition of arts and crafts of our member artists was inaugurated by Kum. Surrendar Saini, President, All India Federation of the Deaf.

The concluding function on 4.10.75, was presided over by the Lt. Governor of Delhi, Shri Kishan Chand. Smt. Sita Kishan Chand distributed prizes, souvenirs and citations among the Founder Members and outstanding members. They all appreciated the long and uninterrupted services of the association.

The concluding function was attended by delegates from organisations of the deaf from all parts of the country.

The Delhi Administration also, as an appreciation for this long and fruitful services, sanctioned a special grant of Rs. 10,000/- for the activities of the association.

On the 5th and 6th October 1975 we hosted the Extra—Ordinary Congress of the All India Federation of the Deaf. The following members were elected to the posts mentioned against their names in the election of Office Bearers of AIFD—Shri R. L. Aggarwal—Hony Treasurer, Shri Onkar Nath Sharma and Shri Mohinder Singh—Executive Committee Members and Shri K. P. Gupta and Shri T. Raghav Committee members.

Cycle Stands :

Keeping of Cycles is our first enterprise, through which we found avenue for the employment of our needy members and through which we also found a part of revenue to meet our expenses. We were allotted the first stand in 1955 and then more came to our keepership as the years passed on. At the moment we have four cycle stands under our keepership and earn a surplus income of about Rs. 3000/- every year after paying salaries. Our heart-felt thanks are due to New Delhi Municipal Committee, Rajghat Samadhi Management, Industrial Development Corporation and the Delhi High Court, for their allotting us their Cycle Stands. We hope more and more organisations will follow them and help the rehabilitation of the Deaf.

Training Centre for Deaf Girls :

This training centre was started in 1967 to train our female members and other needy deaf girls in a vocational trade of employment potentiality. Our experience has taught us that when so many men and women with education and training were candidates for employment, how could the deaf girls, with education not worth the name and no training, even hope for employment. Our training programme worked very successfully and became popular within a few years. For the employment of our successful trainees, who opted to stay with us after completing their courses of studies, we started a production cell attached to this Centre. Its products, ready made Children's Garments, Knit-Wears etc. found ready market. The trainees and employees of the Centre have won many prizes in all India Exhibitions and Competitions of the Deaf.

So far, we have solely financed its expenses and have paid each and every trainee enrolled monthly stipend of Rs. 30/- to Rs. 60/- varying on the duration of training and their need. It is now time that the Government should aid the Centre so that we could channelise our funds for other important activities.

Batik and Fabric Centre for Deaf Girls :

The Centre which was started initially with a view to impart training to willing and needy deaf girls, keeping in view attractive internal and external market for Batik products has turned into a commercial centre. But it can not discard training. Production and training go together. The production did provide jobs to six of our female members which is a great achievement of the centre in itself. The unique feature of this centre is that the artists, and mostly house-wives do the work at the convenience and earn to supplement their family income.

Mook-Preeti :

Prior to the opening of Mook-Preeti there was no place where the products of the deaf could be marketed and given suitable publicity. To give encouragement to self-employed

deaf, and those running cottage industries and engaged in the Handicrafts and Arts and Painting creation, we took a bold step though it costed us very heavily, to open a shop named MOOK-PREETI at a posh shopping centre of New Delhi-Yaswant Place, Chanakyapuri in 1969. Its performance and popularity has justified its opening and continuance. To attract customers and to give employment to our members we have attached a Photography section to the shop. The section has not supplemented our income but has the distinction of serving the people of the area who previously used to go to Connaught Place etc. for their photographic requirements.

With a bit of more labour and investment we hope that the centre would become an asset to the association and would earn substantial amount for its projects and programmes and also for enlarging opportunity for the deaf in its own set up.

Recreation :

The Association has made arrangements for providing to its members sound and healthy recreation. More stress has been given on quality than to quantity of recreation. We maintain a Library and Reading Room and a Club for indoor and outdoor games. Whereas the Library and Reading Room are stocked with good books and magazines which provide our members with the means of mental recreation, our Club gives them opportunity for physical as well as general recreation.

We are giving stress on visual method of recreation more than anything. This has naturally made us to add a TV set to our club. We wish to add more books and magazines to our Library. As soon as we have some more funds we would do this.

Sports :

Nature had been very unkind to us in the year under reference which had resulted in last minute postponement of our 7th Delhi State Games of the Deaf which was to be held on first and second days of October 75. Earlier we had also to postpone our Cricket competition due to heavy downpour. This was a jolt to our Silver Jubilee Celebration programme.

The 7th Delhi State Games of the Deaf was however held on January 3 & 4, 1976. Shri K.R. Ramchandran, Joint Secretary to Govt. of India, Deptt. of Social Welfare inaugurated the Games in a simple but impressive ceremony held on January 3, 1976 at National Stadium. About 350 athletes participated in the march past. The games has 60 events in athletics, Foot Ball, Table Tennis and Wrestling for men and women, boys and girls and junior and sub junior boys and girls. As the Games continued record after record fell as the participants had earlier received better coaching and conditioning. Smt. M.V. Garde, Deputy Secretary to GOI, Deptt. of Social Welfare was Guest of honour of the function.

On January 4, 1976 in the evening, Shri Ram Niwas Mirdha, Union Minister for Defence Production presided over the concluding function and gave away prizes to the winners. He was very pleased to see the standard of performance of athletes. Shri Mirdha has always been kind to us and has always guided and helped us in our problems.

Our performance in General Cariappa Rolling Shield 3rd All India Cricket Championship of the Deaf held in Bombay in Nov-Dec., 1975 was somewhat disappointing. We were pushed to the 3rd place and had to hand over the glittering and prestigious shield to the new Champions, Maharashtra.

We have learnt the lesson and have now started intensive programmes of coaching and conditioning of our sports Men and Women. To encourage them we have instituted our own 'Sports Scholarships' and 'Athletes Care Programme.' We hope for the best in future. Four of our boys and girls qualified for National Sports Scholarships.

Own Home :

Our association has to-day completed twenty six years of existence, but it is still housed in rented premises. It is not only due to our attention and resources being engaged in other projects of importance but also due to high price of buildings and building materials in the open market. However, now we have taken the matter seriously and requested authorities concerned to allot us a suitable plot for the construction of association's home. The home will accommodate all our activities & Training Centres. We further wish to start new projects like School for Deaf Children, Old People's Home etc., as soon as we have enough accommodation. We hope for the best and the best is that our need be considered on merit as well and a suitable plot is allotted to us at the earliest.

I am happy to inform you that our General Body has decided to change the name of the Association from 'Deaf and Dumb Association' Delhi to 'Delhi Association of the Deaf' We are taking necessary action in the matter and the new name will be registered as soon as official formalities are completed.

On this historical occasion, I extend my heartiest congratulations and felicitations to each and every member of the association, our donors, patrons and sympathisers. I also convey to them our heartfelt thanks and gratitude for their help in the activities of the association.

I end this report with 'thank you all'.













At Piccadilli Restaurant, F. Block, Connaught Place, New Delhi M/s Bans Gopal Nigam, Ratan Lal Aggarwal, Vilaity Ram Goyle, Jagdish Chandra Sachdeva, Indernath Chopra and Amrit Lal Tandon discussed the past, present and future of the deaf and decided to form Deaf and Dumb Association Delhi, to work for the rehabilitation of the Deaf through education, training, employment and social adjustment. M/s Bans Gopal Nigam and Ratan Lal Aggarwal were selected as General Secretary and Treasurer respectively with Shri Nigam's residence at 170, Gali Batashan, Chawri Bazar, Delhi as its office.

December 1951

Cricket Match with Y.M.C.A.

March 19, 1952

Mr. Harry F. Latshaw, Director of Special Education, Maryland (USA) and Mrs. Latshaw visited the association and were felicitated.

December 30, 1952

Farewell party to General K.M. Cariappa (Retd) the retiring First Indian Commander-in-Chief of Indian Army at Massey Hall, YMCA.

October 4, 1953

Kum. Shanta Vashista, Education Minister, Delhi State, inaugurated the 3rd Anniversary Celebration of the Association at Town Hall, New Delhi.

November, 1953

Association presented a memorandum requesting the Prime Minister to take necessary steps for the rehabilitation of the Deaf.

May 5, 1954

Sardar Gurmukh Nihal Singh, Speaker, Delhi State Legislative Assembly inaugurated Library of the Association at 4775, Paharganj, New Delhi in a room free of rent spared by Shri R.L. Aggarwal and family.

July 10, 1954

Toys workshop started in another room at 4775, Paharganj, New Delhi.

September 1954

New Delhi Municipal Committee allotted a Cycle Stand, Opp. Singer Sewing Machine Co., Connaught Place on nominal rent for the employment of the deaf. Shri Duni Chand Nagwani was appointed as its first keeper.

Members Onkar Sharma, Devi Singh Chauhan, and Saroj Kumar were employed by New Delhi Municipal Committee through the efforts of the Association and kindness of Late Sri U.B. Basurkar NDMC Vice-President.

May 5, 1955

Sri Satish Chandra I.C.S., Dy Commissioner, Delhi inaugurated first Foundation Day of Library at 4775, Paharganj New Delhi.

June 3, 1955

The Association was registered under Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 and was allotted registration No S-851 of 1955 -56.

August 1, 1955

Office of the Association shifted to 2144 Bazar Sitaram, Delhi.

Sri B.G. Nigam, General Secretary, attended the Second World Congress of the Deaf held in Jagreb (Yugoslavia) on invitation from World Federation of the Deaf and was elected as its Vice-President.

Rs. 5,000/- and Rs. 2,500/- were sanctioned by Govt. of India and State Govt. of Delhi respectively to finance his participation.

September 1955

Representatives of the Association participated in the First Seminar on the Education of the Deaf, organised by Govt. of India at Mussoorie. Most of its suggestions concerning education and employment of the Deaf found place in the resolutions of the Seminar.

December 20, 1955

Minister of Education Delegates of Bengal Deaf & Dumb Association Calcutta, Bombay Deaf & Dumb Society, Bombay, Punjab Organisation of the Deaf, Jullundur, Rajasthan Deaf & Dumb Association Ratangarh, Deaf and Dumb School, Mysore and Assam Deaf and Dumb School, Gauhati attended it. Rs. 1,500/- was sanctioned by Government of India for holding the Conference.

December 22, 1955

Founded All India Federation of the Deaf in presence of Dr. Kailash Nath Katju, Union Defence Minister. Shri B.G. Nigam and Shri R.L. Aggarwal were elected as General Secretary and Treasurer of the Federation respectively.



And so ends a Kathakali performance only to be continued until Ravan dies again and again, and Ram emerges victorious.




