

I am happy that it is able to discharge this role effectively. For this I have to thank the Members for their interest and involvement in the activities, the well-wishers for their material help and moral support and the authorities for their sympathy, understanding and ready assistance.

During the year gone by, the Association was able to score a modest success. While the detailed high-lights will be reflected in the Honorary General Secretary's Annual Report, I shall satisfy myself by saying that the Association was able to host an international Sports event - the first of its kind in India - Australia V/s India cricket Test of the Deaf. It has also been able to provide assistance to its Members in numerous ways. In short the excellent work being done by the Association for the last three decades is going on with renewed vigour.

The Association now faces the biggest challenge of its existence so far. Thanks to the kind interest shown by Shri D. R. Kohli, Delhi's dynamic Lt. Governor, in the welfare and rehabilitation of the deaf, after our persistent efforts, Delhi Development Authority has at long last allotted us 500 sq. yds. of land in Masjid Moth, New Delhi. Though the cost demanded is exorbitant, we are confident that it will be revised and concessional rates charged.

The challenge is this that apart from raising funds to meet the cost of land, the Association shall have to complete the construction work within two years. This is a herculean task and can only be accomplished given the unstinted co-operation of all concerned - our Members, well wishers and the Authorities. I do hope it will be extended without reservation.

For our Members, I have obly praise for the good work they are doing. I expect that they will now realise their increased responsibilities and help the Association translate its dream into reality.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Respected Dr. Chunder Sahib, Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is my pleasure and privilege to welcome you on the occasion of our 29th Anniversary Day Celebrations here today. Due to various factors, we could not celebrate our 28th Anniversary and are therefore, making extra efforts to make these celebrations better than ever before.

Allow me to tell you some thing about the past year's activities. Our major achievement was holding of the Australia V/s India Cricket Test of the Deaf here in Delhi. This was an epoch making event and may prove fore-runner of similar international events in the coming days. This Silent Cricket Test was inaugurated by Shri D. R. Kohli, our esteemed, Lt. Governor of Delhi. We had to spend nearly Rs. 40,000/- in organising this unique sports event and had to put in a lot of hard work but the results have been rewarding.

We also held 10th Delhi Games of the Deaf on 8th and 9th March, 1979. These were declared open by Shri K. N. Sahniji, Chief Executive Councillor, Delhi. Mrs. Britt Finnmark, wife of the Ambassador of Sweden in India gave away the prizes. The sports-meet brought out a rich array of talent. We only wish we had adequate resources to groom this neglected talent further.

Various industrial organisations notably Escorts Limited, Escorts Tractors Ltd., Mercury Travels, Bharat Steel Tubes Ltd., Goetze (India) Ltd. & Mrs. Britt Finnmark very kindly instituted running shields for the winners in the Annual Sports meets. We are grateful to them and place on record our heartfelt thanks to the management of these Companies.

Yet another achievement was that we were able to organise a Holiday Camp for our members at Pahalgam. Nearly 50 members, men, women and children participated in it. The Government of Jammu & Kashmir, especially its Chief Minister, Shri Sheikh Mohd.

●adullah extended our team all help and assistance. Our grateful thanks are, therefore, due to them as well. The encouraging results have prompted us to organise yet another Holiday Camp, again at Pahalgam, later in June, 1979. This will be attended by another batch of 50 lucky members. The Association meets the cost on these Camps.

After our successes, it would be honest to speak some thing about our failures as well. One of our major failures was our inability to participate in the 7th National Games of the Deaf held at Bangalore. As a matter of fact we had made all the preparations, raised funds, reserved railway accomodation etc. but the disturbances in Bangalore and elsewhere in South India following the arrest of Shrimati Indira Gandhi and the resultant cancellation of train services, forced us to abandon the venture at the last minute after the party had assembled at the New Delhi Railway Station for entraining. The last minute call off upset our members and we had to face a number of problems. Our only consolation was that we were able to send two of our ace sportsmen by Air who scored big wins.

Speaking about sports, I cannot but express our happiness at the honours one of our Members, Shri Satish Kumar has earned for himself and our organisation. He was recently presented with Arjuna Award by the President of the Republic.

Now may I say some thing about our future projections. The first on the list of priorities is our participation in the World Congress of the Deaf scheduled to be held in Bulgaria within a couple of months. We are hopeful of sending at least a couple of delegates provided, of course, the assistance from the Government is forthcoming in time.

I am also happy to infom you that the Delhi Develoment Authority has since alloted us a plot of land admeasuring 500 sq. yards in Masjid Moth area. For this we have to thank Shri Kohli Sahib who took a personal interest in this matter and without his support, we may not have been so favoured. We are deeply indebted to him. Even otherwise also, he has been a constant source of inspiration for us. He has spared his valuable time to participate in our various functions and we have been fortunate enough to have a ready access to him. I, therefore, place on record our heartfelt thanks to him.

The only fly in the ointment is that D. D. A. has demanded the price of land at Rs. 3 lacs per acre even though being a voluntary welfare organisation engaged in education and training of the handicapped people, we deserve concessional rates. The matter has been taken up with the authorities and are hopeful that the decision would be revised in our favour. We are ashamed to trouble Shri Kohli Sahib again in this matter but since he is our saviour, we have to place our case before him.

Now that the land has been alloted at long last we will have to start construction work immediately. Therefore, we will require more than good wishes from our well wishers. We would be appraoching them shortly for financial assistance and as the donations made.

to the Association are exempt from Income Tax, it is hoped, our patrons will respond liberally there by enabling us to realise our cherished dream.

Some of our members have won National Awards for the Physically Handicapped. Last year Shri Ramesh Chandra Tuli was so honoured. This year Shri Pran Nath Bahl and Shri Rameshwar have won this coveted honour. Our congratulations to them. It is hoped others will emulate their example.

We have a number of projects on the anvil but will not tire your patience by describing them at this stage. We hope our work will speak for itself when we assemble here next year.

The Association has been able to extend help to its members in diverse ways. Securing admission in Schools and Colleges, scholarships, training facilities, employment assistance etc. are some of our activities. We have been able to find some openings for our members in private organisations but despite reservations of 3 percent posts for handicapped in Government services, the benefit thereof is yet to accrue to us. The Government, it is hoped will ensure strict enforcement of these reservation orders.

Lastly, may I place on record our thanks to all those who have helped us achieve our objectives. Mention of Shri Kohli Sahib and the assistance that he has extended to us has already been made. By his presence here to-day, he has further placed us under heavy obligations. We pray for his long life and prosperity.

Dr. P. C. Chunder, Union Education Minister has also been kind enough to spare some of our valuable time to preside over our Annual Day function. He is the fountain-head of all welfare measures for the handicapped and naturally look upto him for protection and assistance. He is Patron Saviour.

We are also beholden to the management of India International Centre and particularly to Smt N. H. Ramachandran its dynamic Programme Officer for the placing the facilities provided by the Centre at our disposal free of charges. We offer our humble thanks. We hope to be favoured with similar help during the subsequent years as well.

ARENA OF SPORTS

At the onset I extend my heartfelt thanks to the members for reposing their trust in me by electing me as Sports Secretary of the Association. While looking back over the year just completed. I am satisfied to note that we have progressed well in the arena of Sports and Games.

Our Sri Surrender Magan, S. K. Gupta and Sri Satya Prakash were selected for coaching by the All India Sports Council of the Deaf for inclusion in National Cricket Team of the Deaf, which was fielded against Australian National Cricket Team of the Deaf in the series of five Test Matches held through October–November 1978. Finally Sri Magan and Sri Gupta earned Test Caps. Sri Magan's performance as an allrounder was superb throughout the series. His name was imprinted in Golden Letter in the history of Cricket of the Deaf for being the first Deaf to complete century in Test Match.

The Association hosted the 2nd Test Match at New Delhi in Nov. 78. Though match was drawn, the test was very lively and successful throughout.

Due to unforeseen circumstances, Delhi's contingent could not participate in the 7th National Games of the Deaf concluded at Bangalore on December 26, 1978. Still, two of our outstanding athletes Sri Satish Kumar and Sri Man Mohan Gulati participated in the Games. Sri Kumar pocketed three Gold medals, creating new National Records in the medium distance running events.

Tenth Delhi Games of the Deaf-however, was held as scheduled in Nov. 78, with a grant-in-aid of Rs. 5000/- from the Govt. of Delhi Administration.

To speak about Sri Satish Kumar is a great pleasure for me. It has been my privilege to be associated with his training in the early years of his sporting career. He has now become a living legend by becoming first deaf athlete to earn the highest National Recognition

for excellence and achievements in the field of Sports the 'Arjuna Award'. It is not only h
recognition but recognition of the fact that Physically Handicap, particularly hearing and
speech handicap, is no barrier to Sports - what is needed is determination and devotion.
Every up-coming sportsmen and women can take lesson form Sri Satish Kumar's life.


Just a fresh from his achievements in Australia vrs India Test Cricke Series of the



Meet Our Arjuna Award Winner

Shri Satish Kumar




Shri Satish Kumar receiving Arjuna Award from President of India

Satish Kumar the recipient of Arjuna Award 1977-78 (Athletics) for his consistent good performance at national and international levels, was born in October 1955. The boy is handicapped in hearing and sight in one eye by severe illness. In spite of his multiple handicaps he preserved his sportive spirit right from his school days. His constant practice with hearing helped him to maintain the highest calibre of sporting. He has never dampened his spirit by slight consequences. He has proven his mettle for the previous three years at national sports meets organised by All India Sports Council of the Deaf at the XIIIth World Games of the Deaf held at Bucharest, Rumania in July 1977, he placed himself at the fourth position in Reduced 25 Km. Marathon with timing of 1 hr 31 minutes 7 sec. He is the only person in the country to achieve such a position in international competition in athletics. He is the first India handicapped to ever break the barrier. In spite of winning so many prizes he is never carried off by vanity. Instead, he is humble in his bearing and ever determined. His determination and deep devotion to sports has helped him to overcome physical handicap particularly in the field of competitive sports. He is employed in Food Corporation of India, New Delhi.

Meet Our National Award Winner:

Shri Ramesh Chandra Tuli

Born deaf in 1941, Shri Ramesh Chander Tuli had also to undergo the trauma of partition when his family migrated from West Pakistan. Imbued with a burning desire to make a success of his life inspite of the handicap, he studied for about 9 years in the Lady Noyce School for the Deaf, Delhi, passed the Hindi Rattan examination from Punjab University in 1958 and completed a five year Diploma Course of the All India Council for Technical Education from the Delhi College of Arts in 1966. Having become a qualified Commercial Artist, it was not difficult for him to secure a job as a Junior Artist in the Central Statistical Organisation where he worked for three years and acquired valuable experience in turning out quality work in field. He kept of looking for a further opening for his advancement in his field and later was selected as a Senior Artist in the Civil Supply Organisation of the Ministry of Civil Supplies and Cooperation. He feels that abiding faith in God, hard work and a desire to succeed have enable him to make a success of his life.

Shri Pran Nath Bahl

Born deaf in 1943 Shri P.N. Bahl suffered the trauma of partition when his family migrated from West Pakistan. He had his schooling in Govt. Lady Noyce School, New Delhi. He developed a taste for Drawing and Art and obtained the National Diploma in Art of the All India Council for Technical Education in 1968. He joined as Assistant (Arts and Crafts) in the Department of Civil Supplies and Cooperation in 1969. In his profession, he has been equally successful and his performance in the discharge of his duties has been adjudged superior to others. A very moving comment indeed on what a handicapped person can do.

Shri Bahl has also distinguished himself in the field of sports, especially cricket. According to his superiors his handicap has brightened his behaviour, sharpened his sincerity and polished his performance.

Shri Rameshwar Dayal Tawakley

Deaf and Dumb since birth, Shri Rameshwar Dayal Tawakley received early education upto primary level in the Government Lady Noyce School for the Deaf. He started his career as a tailor but shifted to the printing trade as a Treadle Machine Operator in the All India Federation of the Deaf. His output is extraordinarily good. He is very amiable, social and very popular among his fellow workers. He works for more than 18 hours a day and has absolutely no inhibition in attending to jobs assigned to him from shopping to machine operation. Indeed, his physical disability has sharpened his desire to make his way in life with unflinching determination.
