





Foreword ...

The Souvenir is dedicated in letter and spirit to the 33rd Anniversary of the Delhi Association of the Deaf.

The year 1981, which was observed as the International Year of Disabled Persons had generated considerable interest of the society as well as the Government in projects and programmes for the rehabilitation of the physically handicapped. Results of resolutions of various seminars, meetings etc. have far reaching effect in shaping the future of the physically handicapped.

Delhi made a lead by providing its physically handicapped population with Identity Cards, to save them from any and every high hardness and indiscrimination which may result in day to day life as a consequence of their physical handicap. The Delhi Transport Corporation has allowed these people "free travel" facilities on buses run by it. Delhi Development Authority very strictly follows its reservation policy for allotment of flats to physically handicapped. The draw is made among the physically handicapped themselves. There are many more facilities and benefit available for the physically handicapped in Delhi. Yet many more facilities are needed to compensate them for the physical handicap.

One of most needed facility is 'Railway Travel Concession'. Other categories of physically handicapped have already been brought under preview of this facility. Yet the deaf for reasons not known to us are yet to be granted this facility.

The Delhi Association of the Deaf alongwith its other programme of Total Rehabilitation and Social Adjustment has made it a point to request to Ministry of Railways, Govt. of India to grant the Deaf "Railway Concession", keeping in view their physical handicap and financially weak status.

The Delhi Association of the Deaf has received ample support from all concerned and we are grateful for this.

Report ...

Since its inception in 1950 the Delhi Association of the Deaf has the unique distinction of hosting several National programmes of the Deaf, be it in the arena of sports or in field of Cultural activities.

A party of more than 65 Athletes boys and girls from Delhi participated in the 9th National Games of the Deaf at Patna in October 1982. Our Arjuna Awardee Shri Satish Kumar won 4 Gold Medals and Rita Rani (Sub-Jr. Girls) won 2 Gold Medals. Delhi Team won 6 gold, 6 silver and 4 bronze medals and took fifth position in 14 states.


Our Cricket Team participated in 2nd North Zone Cricket Championship of the Deaf at Jaipur in April 1983 and again won the championship and has been qualified for the General Cariappa Rolling Shield.

Our team of 6 male and 1 female players participated in 2nd National Chess Championship of the Deaf at Indore in Aug. 1983. Shri Subhash Kapoor, Onkar Sharma and Prafulla Kamboj won first, second and third prizes respectively. Delhi Team won Men group Championship.

As winners of 2nd North Zone Cricket Championship of the Deaf, we have been in Semi Final of the 7th National Cricket Championship of the Deaf to be held at Hyderabad in December 1983. Most of our players have also qualified for inclusion in North Zone Cricket Team to participate in 2nd National Cricket Championship of the Deaf for Zones to be held at Hyderabad in December, 1983. Coaching Camp for North Zone Team will start from 3rd December 1983 for 15 days. Our State team and North Zone Team both will leave for Hyderabad on 19-12-83 to participate in the said championships.

We have received ample financial and moral support from Sports loving establishments and other helping hands for which we are thankful.

October 4, 1950

Piccadilli Restaurant, F. Block, Connaught Place, New Delhi M/s Bans Gopal Nigam, Ratan Lal Aggarwal, Vilaity Ram Goyle, Jagdish Chandra Sachdeva, Inder Nath Chopra and Amrit Lal Tandon discussed the past, present and future of the deaf and decided to form Deaf and Dumb Association Delhi to work for rehabilitation of the Deaf through education, training, employment and social adjustment. M/s. Bans Gopal Nigam and Ratan Lal Aggarwal were selected as General Secretary and Treasurer respectively with Shri Nigam's residence at 170, Gali Batashan, Chawri Bazar, Delhi as its office.

December, 1951

Cricket Match with Y.M.C.A.

March 19, 1952

Mr. Harry F. Latshaw, Director of Special Education, Marylands (USA) and Mrs. Lastsaw visited the association and felicitated.

December 30, 1952

Farewell party to General K. M. Cariappa (Retd.), the retiring First Indian Commander-in-Chief of India Army at Massey Hall, YMCA.

October 4, 1953

Kum. Shanta Vashista, Education Minister, Delhi State, inaugurated the 3rd Anniversary Celebration of the Association at Town Hall, New Delhi.

November 1953

Association presented a memorandum requesting the Prime Minister to take necessary steps for the rehabilitation of the Deaf.

May 5, 1954

Sardar Gurmukh Nihal Singh, Speaker, Delhi State Legislative Assembly inaugurated Library of the Association at 4775, Paharganj, New Delhi in a rent free room spared by Shri R. L. Aggarwal and family.

July 10, 1954

Toys-workshop started in another room at 4775, Paharganj, New Delhi.

September 1954

New Delhi Municipal Committee allotted a Cycle Stand, Opp. Singer Sewing Machine Co., Connaught Place on nominal rent for the employment of the deaf. Shri Duni Chand Nagwani was appointed as its first keeper.

Dec. 1954

Members Onkar Sharma, Devi Singh Chauhan, and Saroj Kumar were employed by New Delhi Municipal Committee through the efforts of the Association and kindness of Late Sri U.B. Basurkar NDMC Vice-President.

May 5, 1955

Sri Satish Chandra I.C.S., Dy. Commissioner, Delhi inaugurated first Foundation Day of Library at 4775, Paharganj New Delhi.

June 3, 1955

The Association was registered under Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 and was allotted registration No. S-851 of 1955-56.

August 1, 1955

Office of the Association shifted to 2144 Bazar Sita Ram, Delhi.

Sri B. G. Nigam, General Secretary, attended the Second World Congress of the Deaf held in Jagreb (Yugoslavia) on invitation from World Federation of the Deaf and was elected as its Vice-President.

Rs. 5,000/- and Rs. 2,500/- were sanctioned by Govt. of India and Govt. of Delhi State respectively to finance his participation.

September 1955

Representatives of the Association participated in the First Seminar on the Education of the Deaf, organised by Govt. of India at Mussoorie. Most of its suggestions concerning education and employment of the Deaf found place in the resolutions of the Seminar.

December 20, 1955

Hosted first All India Conference of the Deaf at Constitution Club, New Delhi under Presidentship of Dr. Shrimali, Union Dy. Minister of Education. Delegates of Bengal Deaf & Dumb Association Calcutta, Bombay Deaf & Dumb Society, Bombay Punjab Organisation of the Deaf, Jullundur, Rajasthan Deaf & Dumb Association, Retangarh, Deaf and Dumb School, Mysore and Assam Deaf and Dumb School, Gauhati attended it. Rs. 1,500/- was sanctioned by Government of India for holding the Conference.

December 22, 1955

Founded All India Federation of the Deaf in presence of Dr. Kailash Nath Katju, Union Defence Minister. Shri B.G. Nigam and Shri R.L. Aggarwal were elected as General Secretary and Treasurer of the Federation respectively.

July 1956

Amended Constitution approved by the General Body.

Kum. Gurdip Kaur become first women member of the Executive Committee.

December 14, 1956

Dr. Draguljob Vuckotic, President of World Federation of the Deaf, visited our association and was feliciated.

December 27, 1956

Hosted reception to Mr. Li Shih-Han Member of the Committee of the China Welfare Association of the Deaf at its Library premises. Dr. Draguljob Vukotic was also present.

April 1957

Central Social Welfare Board sanctioned Rs. 3,000/- towards salaries for Night School teacher and workshop instructor, and purchase of spray machine and Library books for the year 1957-58.

July 1957

Workshop and Library shifted to 92, Kamla Market, New Delhi.

March 10, 1958

Pt. Gobind Vallabh Pant, Union Home Minister, presided over the seventh Anniversary Celebration of the Association and

inaugurated Exhibition of Handicrafts of the Deaf at Darbar Hall of Municipal Corporation of Delhi.

April 1958

Central Social Welfare Board sanctioned Rs. 2822.50 for the purchase of workshop machinery and Library books for the year 1958-59.

January 20, 1958

Prime Minister Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, sanctioned 5,000/- from P.M.'s Women and Children Welfare Fund.

August 1959

Sri V. R. Goyle, Treasurer participated in Third World Congress of the Deaf held in Weisbden (West Germany) at his own cost. Sri B.G. Nigam also participated as All India Federation of the Deaf's representative.

November 1959

Participated in Second All India Congress of the All India Federation of the Deaf held in Calcutta. Won many prizes in All India Exhibition and Drama Competitions.

M/s Bans Gopal Nigam and Ratan Lal Aggarwal re-elected as General Secretary and Treasurer of the Federation respectively.

March 19, 1960

Sri Bhagwan Sahay, Chief Commissioner, Delhi presided over the 9th Anniversary Celebration of the Association.

March 20, 1960

First Charity Show of Dance by the deaf was organised which received thunderous applause and praise from the public.

July 30, 1961

Night Education classes for Adult Deaf started.

July 13, 1962

Founder Member Sri V.R. Goyal died in a road accident.

September 13, 1962

Founder Member Sri Jagdish Chand Sachdeva died of heart failure.

November 19, 1962

L. Dina Nath Jhallani, Ex. President died in an accident.

August, 1963

Participated in Convention of the Teachers of the Deaf in India held at Bangalore. Sri Onkar Nath Sharma got elected as its Executive Committee Member.

February 24, 1965

Participated in the 2nd All India Deaf & Dumb Sport Meet held at National Stadium, New Delhi. Won Team Championship of Women section and were runner-up in Men section. Prime-Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri distributed prizes to the winners.

The All India Sports Council of the Deaf was founded. Shri Onkar Sharma became first General Secretary of the Council.

July 1966

Office of the Association shifted and registered at 92, Kamla Market, New Delhi,

October 4, 1966

Cultural activities of the Association resulted in public presentation of J. S. Jurgnev's MUMU, based on a Russian Love Story, at New Delhi - with an all deaf artist cart directed by Sri Satish Sehgal. Artists received high appreciation for their performance.

November 21, 1966

Mumu's staging at All India Fine Art and Craft Hall, New Delhi highly acclaimed by the spectators and the press.

May 21, 1967

Another performance of Mumu at Kanpur, on invitation from Dynamic Young Circle. Sri Prakash, Ex. Governor Bombay and Madras inaugurated it.

July 1967

Vice President Onkar Sharma participated in the International Teachers of the Deaf Convention held in Washington DC, USA. The Association financed his participation.

July-August 1967

Sri R. L. Aggarwal attended the 6th World Congress of the Deaf at Warsaw (Poland) and visited Italy, U.K. France, West Germany, Switzerland.

September 13, 1967

Sri Madan Mohan Vashista, Joint-Secretary, proceed to USA for higher studies in the Gallaudet College, Washington, D.C.

October 1-4, 1967

17th Anniversary Celebration of the Association at Town Hall, New Delhi.

December 1967

Tailoring Training Centre for Deaf Girls started functioning at 92, Kamla Market, New Delhi.

August 1968

Sri R.L. Aggarwal attended International Conference of Handicapped at Hongkong.

October 19-21, 1968

Hosted 3rd Congress of the All India Federation of the Deaf. Kum. Surrender Saini, R.L. Aggarwal, Onkar Sharma, Suraj Prakash, as Executive Vice-President, Hony Treasurer and Members of the Executive Committee respectively of AIFD, and Smt. Mukti Uppal and Sri C.P. Kanchanbaras were also elected as members of its Central Committee.

September 13, 1969

Shri Y. B. Chavan, Union Home Minister inaugurated Association's first Commercial Enterprise-cum-Photo Studio-cum Show window of the products of the deaf. "Mook Preeti" at 6B, Yashwant Place, Chanakya Puri, New Delhi.

Rajghat Samadhj Committee and the National Industries Development Corporation allotted cycle stands at Rajghat Samadhj and Chanakya Bhavan respectively on nominal rent.

March 1969

Participated in the 3rd All India Deaf & Dumb Sports Meet organised by All India Sports Council of the Deaf in Calcutta and retained Championship of women group.

Shri Onkar Sharma re-elected General Secretary of the Council. Sri Harish Kumar Chug also elected to its Executive Board.

March 21, 1970

Shri Vassand Rai Nagwani received National Award for the Best Physically handicapped Employee from the President of India Shri V.V. Giri.

October 4, 1970

20th Anniversary of the Association celebrated.

January 20, 1971

Organised 4th Delhi State Deaf & Dumb Sports Meet at Salwan School Ground. Air Chief Marshal Arjun Singh inaugurated the Meet and Smt. Chand Chhabra distributed prizes to the winners.

July-August, 1971

Shri R.L. Aggarwal attended the 6th World Conference of WFD held in Paris.

December 1971

Shri Onkar Sharma attended CISS Winter Games in Switzerland.

October 2, 1972

5th Delhi State Deaf & Dumb Sports Meet inaugurated by Shri Radha Raman, Chief Executive Councillor, Delhi.

October 19, 1972

Shri Krishna Swaroop, Executive Councillor, (Social Welfare) Delhi, presided over the 22nd Anniversary celebration of the Association and distributed prizes to the winner of 5 DSDCSM.

November 1972

Participated in 4th All India Deaf & Dumb Sports Meet organised by the All India Sports Council of the Deaf in Lucknow and retained Team Championship in Women section and swept Girl section event.

Sri K.K. Sinha, Sri R.L. Aggarwal, and Sri H.K. Chug were elected as General Secretary, Treasurer and Member of AISCD respectively.

May 1973

Participated in the 4th All India Congress of AIFD held at Gauhati (Assam). There our women members gave a performance of 'Amar Prem' and won 1st Prize.

June 10, 1973

Athletes, Kum. Varsha Miglani, Kum. Raj Kumari Sri Mange Ram Saini, Sri Manmohan Gulati, Sri Subhash Gupta, Sri Shivraj Gupta and Sri Abdul Waheed selected by the All India Sports Council of the Deaf for coaching at Netaji Subhash National Institute of Sports, Patiala.

July-August 1973

Athletes Sri Manmohan Gulati and Sri Subhash Gupta participated in the XIIth World Games of the Deaf held in Malmo, Sweden. Sri K.K. Sinha accompanied the Indian contingent as Chief de-Mission.

Kum. Maya Rani and Kum. Neelam Handa received National Sports Scholarships.

March 9-17, 1974

Hosted General Cariappa Rolling Shield, Second All India Cricket Championship of the Deaf. President of India Shri V.V. Giri distributed prizes to the winners. The Shield was won by Delhi Team.

Govt. of Delhi Administration sanctioned Rs. 10,000/- for the Championship.

Col. P.N. Luthra, Secretary to GOI, Deptt of Social Welfare presided over the 24th Anniversary celebration.

Five Cricketers of our champion team awarded National Sports Scholarships.

October 4, 1974

December 22-25, 1974

Participated in 5th All India Deaf & Dumb Sports Meet organised by AISCD in Madras and won 'Thomas Cup' on becoming champion in Senior Boys Group and also got second place with 50 medals in over all team championship.

August-September 1975

Shri R.L. Aggarwal attended International Congress on Education of the Deaf held in Tokyo, Japan.

October 3, 1975

Organised "Seminar on Deafness" under the chairmanship of Smt. Habiba Kidwai, Chairman, Delhi Social welfare Advisory Board to find out ways and means for the Total Rehabilitation of the Deaf.

Our Sister Organisation, Delhi Foundation of the Deaf Women gave a performance of "I TOO AM A GIRL" which received wide acclamation from the audience and was telecasted from Delhi Television Station.

October 4, 1975

Lt. Governor of Delhi, Shri Kishan Chand inaugurated the Exhibition and presided over the concluding function of the Silver Jubilee Celebrations.

Smt. Sita Kishan Chand gave away prizes to outstanding members and workers

October 5, 1975

Hosted Extra-Ordinary Congress of the All India Federation of the Deaf at newly constructed Multipurpose Training Centre for the Deaf Campus, New Delhi.

October 6, 1975

Member R.L. Aggarwal and Onkar Sharma were re-elected as Treasurer and Executive Committee Member of AIFD. Member Mohinder Singh, Advocate was also elected to E.C. of AIFD. Shri K.P.-Gupta, Principal, Govt. Lady Noyce School for the Deaf and Shri T. Raghava were also elected as members of Central Committee of AIFD.

Nov.-December, 1975

Participated in General Cariappa Rolling Shield 3rd All India Cricket Championship of the Deaf of AISCD held in Bombay.

January 3-4, 1976

Organised 7th Delhi State Games of the Deaf at National Stadium, New Delhi. Shri K.R. Ramchandran, Jt. Secretary, Deptt. of S.W. GOI inaugurated the Games and Smt. M.V. Garde, Dy. Secretary. in the same Department acted as starter for the first event of the day.

Shri R.N. Mirdha, Union Minister for Defence Production presided over the concluding Ceremony of the Games and distributed prizes to the winners.

March, 1976

The Delhi Administration sanctioned Rs. 10,000/- as special grant to the Association on the occasion of Silver Jubilee Celebration.

August, 1976

A Television Set was added to the Recreation Club.

September, 1976

October 4, 1976

Celebration of the 26th Anniversary of the Association at NDMC Auditorium.

November 7, 1976

8th Delhi Games of the Deaf organised at Northern Railway Stadium, New Delhi.

December, 1976

Participated in 6th National Games of the Deaf held at Hyderabad, won the Championship in wrestling and 2nd position in over all championship the Games.

January 13, 1977

New year receptions and prizes distribution to the athletes who took part in 6th National Games at Lodhi Gardens,

May 29, 1977

New Delhi Deaf & Dumb Club (1960) merged with the Deaf & Dumb Association. Delhi (1950) to form DELHI ASSOCIATION OF THE DEAF this day has been declared as "Unity Day".

July 14, 1977

Members K.K. Sinha and Satiah Kumar participated in the XIII World Games of the Deaf held at Bucharest (Romania). Athlete Satish Kumar won the 4th place in 25 Km Race.

August 8, 1977

Members Suraj Prakash and Mohinder Singh Advocate participated as delegates in International Conference of Deafness held at Copenhagen (Denmark).

September, 1977

Member Shri T.M. Jacob got selected for the National Scholarship for higher studies abroad. He will do his Ph.D. in USA.

October 4, 1977

27th Anniversary of the Association was inaugurated by Shri Kedar Nath Sahani, Chief Executive Councillor, Delhi.

October 4, 1977

Member Shri Vinod Kumar Kanwar left for Vienna (Austria) for higher studies.

June, 1978

Our Team of 50 members participated in Holiday Camp in Kashmir. Govt. of Jammu & Kashmir extended all help and assistance to them.
