

Chairman's Report

Chairman

Another cheque has been cashed from the life span of every one of us since we met at this very venue and on the same date last year. Thank God, we are meeting again and in larger numbers too, with some modest achievements. In a very imperilled world, it is reassuring to find the human race intact.

Let me first confess my own failing. I have not been able to devote much time and energy to the growth of this Association, a true organisation for self-help effort by the deaf because of personal problems which kept me mostly out of Delhi. But I am proud to report that D.A.D. as they call our organisation, has gone from strength to strength despite being confronted by adverse conditions and inherent problems that face every dedicated organisation of the physically handicapped especially that of deaf and deaf-mute. This is entirely because D.A.D. is gifted with so many self-sacrificing diligent workers who also do not lack leadership qualities. They are too modest to permit me to name them. Besides my absence has been more than filled up by my esteemed friend Shri Hari Krishna Shastri, M.P. and his wife who despite tremendous pre-occupation find time to guide and help the Association. They are at home with these silent children of God.

As the General Secretary's report has detailed out, the D.A.D. has accomplished so much. Its membership has increased more than two fold. Indeed it is the only Organisation of the Deaf and Dumb in North India worth its name. It organised the greatest ever sports meet of deaf and dumb in Jawahar Lal Nehru Stadium, thanks to the untiring efforts put in by Shri and Shrimati Shastri. It organised more than one educational and recreational tour for its members to enlarge their intellectual horizon and experience of life and establish fraternal relation with similar organisations in East, West, South and North.

The D.A.D. has also succeeded, thanks to the personal interest of the Hon'ble Lt. Governor of Delhi, Shri H L. Kapur, who has been extending support to the deaf and dumb in getting an alternative plot for its building project and thus the litigation relating to original allotment in Masjid Moth area has ended. Now funds are being collected to start actual construction at the earliest. The best charity for any firm any individual business or other organisation would be donating liberally to this worthy project which will provide multiple facilities to the deaf and dumb in Delhi and outside too. I am sure that special interest being shown by philanthropists and industrialists like Shri Bansi Dhar, Chairman & Sr. Managing Director of DCM Limited and Raizada Kedar Nath Modi of Modi Group of industries, Sh. Sunder T. Vachani of Weston Electronics also worthy Lt. Governor will see this project through.

Apart from promoting sports and other physical welfare and cultural activities among the deaf and dumb, the D.A.D. is making every attempt to provide them social security by providing assistance in getting employment and getting the complaints of those already employed, redressed. It is proposed to expand this activity. Most of our members are modestly settled and this mainly due to their self-reliance and self-help efforts. What the deaf and dumb need is neither pity nor charity. They only want what is due to them as human beings and citizens of an enlightened democracy but for various reasons it is largely denied to them. They only want human dignity and understanding and reasonable help in their self-help efforts, the same which other people get.

The D.A.D. has more ambitious plans in view for implementation. But it is no use to advertise them in advance. It is our motto "Accomplish first and claim credit later". Among many of its handicaps is that some previous office bearers have with-held most of old records and even funds. But we believe as Dr. Martin Luther King the Black Leader did—"we shall overcome".

We start our 37th year with stronger resolve, greater faith in God and in fellow human-beings. We strive and hope of the best.

I Confess My Failure

Born in Sringer-Kashmir, I lost my hearing faculty completely at the age of 14 due to an attack of complicated type of typhoid which caused over fifteen days of complete unconsciousness. I had just started my third year in the college and was supposed to be a gifted student. This calamity cut short my educational career and, within one and a half year, I lost both of my parents. However, I had succeeded in launching myself as a journalist with Urdu medium and soon rose to be an assistant editor in a daily launched by the late Sher-I-Kashmir Sheikh Mohd. Abdullah. I did not then know that the curse which has fallen on me was not remediable. So, I landed into Lahore in search of cure and settled there. Within less than two years, the partition brought me to Delhi via Kashmir and Amritsar.

It was only in the early fifties that I learnt that there were so many deaf-and-deaf-mutes, when an article about myself brought hundreds of letters and also the founder Secretary of this Association, Bans Gopal Nigam to me. It was there I began my association with a true friend and sharer of common misfortune, Devi Singh Chauhan, the present Secretary of the Association. He had also joined the body near about the same time.

It was a shocking revelation to me that the incidence of deafness resulting in muteness also in case of those born deaf or losing hearing in early was widespread. I also came to know that politics had already made in-roads among the deaf also, and there was rival body of the deaf. Unfortunately, the bodies of the deaf are run on political lines and some politicians have not hesitated to exploit them for their own ends-though some others have been really helpful.

Anyway, at the time both the bodies had only nominal existence and membership was confined mostly to boys and girls who had attained little education at the Government Noyce School for the Deaf. A good number of them belonged to well-to-do families. Devi Singh and myself helped to build the Association into a regular body and started some constructive work. Then came a lady M.P. (she is now dead and I will not name her) and she launched the All India Federation of the Deaf. Since we had raised objections to abuse of funds, we were both pushed out.

The lady M.P. was very influential, so she was able to get grants, quotas, permits (for non-existent workshops) big donations and so on, almost all of which was wasted on foreign trips, window dressing and other wrong uses, and nothing solid was done for the deaf and mutes. It was then what I learned that there were thousands of such deaf-mutes of poor families in and around Delhi who could not get even minimum education or vocational training and were leading sub-animal existence in slums, basties and villages. Most of them had been rendered mentally retarded as well.

When our efforts to reform the Association and its a pex body failed, we joined what was called All India Deaf and Dumb Society though it had hardly any regular office or outside membership. Its local members used to assemble in Y.M.C.A. We, however, built it into real body, established its office in Kamla Market and a Welfare Centre in Teliwara, followed it up by establishing branches in many States and securing affiliations of organisations in West Bengal and Bombay. We were also able to secure Government recognition and some grants too and collected considerable funds through flag sales and donations. The first Co-operative Society of the deaf with a weaving centre was also launched. Unfortunately,

however, misunderstanding arose between myself and Devi Singh, which, of course did not last long, but ended only when I was forced to resign from this out fit as well, Devi Singh had already left though not on quite valid reasons.

The President of the Society was another lady M.P. She perhaps still holds this honour although the real powers lie elsewhere. I would even now vouch-safe her personal integrity. She was never after pelf. Power, yes. Money, no. In personal relations she was very kind. The same I cannot say about her minions. My quarrel with her rose because when a few of her follower saw plenty of money coming into the coffers of the Society, their eyes widened with greed. I refused transfer some money in an illegal manner and cover malpractices of two of her favourites. Instead, I resigned from the General Secretaryship of Society much against her wishes. Later, tussle cropped up over co-operative society election. I commanded a majority. But obviously with her consent, her chief minion bribed before my very eyes about 12 members. So, I lost the election. That did not pain me. What pained me was this act of betrayal and using poor deaf with little or no education as pawns in the dirty game. So shocked I was that I decided to wash my hands off these so-called deaf and dumb organisations for ever. That was over 18 years ago.

During this period I have watched the Society shrink to its old size, then being bossed by another lady. She has done a little window dressing like opening a small school in Haryana. She has collected funds, apart from flag sales and donations, by holding big melas and exhibitions and launching a couple of lotteries. All the founder members except one have left the Society.

The story of the rival Federation is no better. It is also bossed by a lady. She probably is the life President and two of her supporters have become virtually life office bearers. The Federation also collects large amounts by flag sales and donations. It also issued one lottery. Of course there is nothing wrong in collecting funds for deaf but such money must be used for welfare of actually deserving. Were that the case I need not, write all this, instead I would have applauded the lady and her compatriots. She has, of course put, up a lot of window dressing.

There is so-called printing institute, the machines of which were donated by a foreign country. But no deaf is trained there. A couple of them are employed for peon's work and the press is run as commercial enterprise by and for non-deaf. Again, there is multipurpose training institute housed in what looks an imposing building near IIT. Beyond it has risen a large three storey hostel building which can house a hundred or more deaf-mutes. But it will prove waste because not even 50 deaf residents will be available. So finally it may also end up as a private enterprise, in a strange way it has been already decided to take the buildings out of control of the Federation and hand it over to a nominated Trust.

The multi-purpose institute has a dozen workers only and a considerable staff including some deaf who are justly agitating for wage rise. The good part of the funds of the Federation is wasted on foreign tours of its 'permanent' or semi-permanent office bearers and lavish salaries and allowances for them. Only one of them works really full time.

It was the duty of the Government to see that funds collected for the deaf were used for real welfare and rehabilitation activities. But there has never been any proper check. Even the use of grants given by it are not effectively checked. What is the net result?

The conditions of the deaf and mutes are no better than these were 30 years ago. Even the working of Government Institutions and departments concerned with the deaf is far from satisfactory. Even now there is not a single higher secondary school for the unfortunate segment of population. The standard of teaching and upkeep of lower secondary schools is very poor. And even now nobody cares about poor and totally illiterate deaf and dumb spread over slums, villages and katras of old city. If some of the deaf and deaf-mutes belonging to affluent or middle class families have established themselves in life and become self-reliant, it is entirely due to hard struggle that they/and their parents have waged, and of sheer preserverance. Even they are discriminated against and exploited.

I remember that just few days before Chinese aggression, when the country was

crisis ridden, Prime Minister Jawahar Lal Nehru agreed to receive a deputation led by me. Fifteen minutes of his precious time were allotted. When we trooped into his office in South Block, many important people including Dalai Lama were waiting outside. I handed over a 15 page memorandum to Panditji. I thought he will send it to his Secretary and have few words with us. No, he read the whole manuscript, then and there which was about our problems and misuse of funds. Then there was oral discussion. When we had already taken 45 minutes of Panditji's time he said "Even as P.M. I cannot fire a peon on my own, but I will see".

And he did see. The lady M.P. lost all the patronage and was never given ticket or office again. We want that sort of enquiry and action to prevent wastage and misuse of funds collected in the name of deaf.

Now, you may ask when I had given up how I am elected as Executive President of Delhi Association of the deaf. The answer is that a large number of members of both organisations got fed up with the existing organisations and formed New Delhi Deaf and Dumb Club for only games and recreational activities. It did not collect funds from people initially. Being a social animal I sought its membership. Later on, talks for merger of the Club and Deaf & Dumb Association were carried on which succeeded after many failures. The two merged into a new body named Delhi Association of Deaf. As the life members of the Club I became a member of DAD automatically. But I did not take any active part because of my own problems.

Soon the old trouble was back. The D.A.D. was again bossed by ex-bosses who refused even to hold annual election. The matter was taken to court which ordered election conducted by a Commissioner appointed by it. My friend Chauhan prevailed upon me to run for the post I am holding. I agreed in the hope I shall try to bring rapprochement between the rival factions. The old bosses lost the election, but would not co-operate with newly elected ones. They refused to give accounts and held back bulk of records to impede the works and perhaps to hide skeleton in their cupboards. The matter is still in the Court. Under the circumstances how I could hold reconciliation talks? Besides, I have been unable to do some regular work for the Organisation because of personal difficulties. At the best I give some advice or attend a meeting or two. The show is being run and run very properly, effectively and dedicatedly by Devi Singh Chauhan and his band and I am very proud of them.

I must confess that inspite of good education and experience in public affairs as a "veteran" journalist, I have failed to do what should be done for the deaf because I and so many like me including Devi Singh are helpless before dirty politics, corruption and difficulty of communication with deaf and deaf-mutes, who are a sensitive lot and are easily misguided. Our failure is nation's failure and we cannot but be sorry and ashamed for this state of affairs.

But now D.A.D. is making a new experiment which is progressing very slowly but surely. I pin my hopes on its success. May God grant us that booa—Amen.



Hony. Secretary's Report

The year just ended has been relatively fruitful. Let me recount some of the achievements, even through modest.

Members being our richest asset, we may take justifiable pride in the fact that in a single year, our membership has more than doubled and we now have over 500 members, bulk of whom are life-members. It has also been our pleasure and a rare privilege to welcome within our fold two illustrious personages—Shri Hari Krishnaji Shastri and his esteemed wife Shrimati Vibha Shastri. This couple, out of nobleness of heart and so as to totally identify itself with us, our hopes and aspirations become our members. Their presence has been a constant source of inspiration for us.

Financially too, it was a far better year. We were able to raise nearly 85,000 rupees by way of grants, donations, advertisements and membership fee which accounted for nearly 20,000 rupees and is the highest ever collected. Our accounts, now under preparation, when audited will be circulated for the kind information of all those who have lent us their support.

Apart from carrying normal activities and providing assistance to our members, we were able to accomplish the following :

Organised a Holiday Camp for our members in Kashmir. However, due to disturbed conditions in the region, not many could participate.

Celebrated Independence Day with picnic in Lodhi Gardens, New Delhi. More than 500 members with their families joined us. A unique feature was that several Members of Parliament, Shri Jag Parvesh Chandra, Chief Executive Councillor, Delhi and Shri Kuldip Singh Gujral, Chairman, D.E.S.C. of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi broke bread with us. Lala Bansi Dhar, Chairman and Senior Managing Director, DCM Limited presented gifts to our newly wed members and distributed sweets.

Played host to visiting members of Madras Association of the Deaf and celebrated Mahatma Gandhi's Birth Day in their presence.

Celebrated Foundation Day on October 4, 1985 with rejoicing at Y.M.C.A., New Delhi. Mr. Basil Egbert, Asstt. Secretary, Y.M.C.A. provided us requisite facilities free of charges.

Organised an educational tour of South India in December, 85 for 40 of our members. The team visited Tirupati, Madras, Madurai, Rameshwaram, Kanya Kumari, Trivendrum, Bangalore, Mysore etc. Except for the last three places, at every place local organisation of the Deaf played host, provided boarding lodging etc. and our members were able to establish personal contacts with their friends in South India. At Tirupati, Shri Lakshminarayanan, Executive Officer, T.T. Devasthanams arranged for our party's stay and special Darshan.

The stellar event of the year's achievements was holding of 15th Delhi Games of the Deaf on January 12, 1986 at Jawahar Lal Nehru Stadium, New Delhi under the inspiring chairmanship of Shri Hari Krishnaji Shastri. Shri H.L. Kapur, Lt. Governor, Delhi inaugurated the Games and administered the oath to participants. Seth Kedar Nathji Modi, Chairman, Modi Group of Companies presided over the inaugural function in the morning.

In the evening Shri K.P. Singh Deo, Minister of State for Food & Civil Supplies

was the Chief Guest and gave away the prizes. Shri Daljit Singh, Chairman, Pure Drinks (New Delhi) Ltd. presided.

A notable feature of the sports meet was that on learning of our plight and vain chase for grant, Shri H.L. Kapur, Lt. Governor, Delhi announced a grant of Rs. 15,000/- on the spot for sports promotion. Shri Modi, large hearted philanthropist that he is, followed suit and announced a donation of Rs. 11,000/- to the Association. Both these sums were made available to us within a matter of days.

On January 5, 1986, the Association arranged a get-together to celebrate New Year. Sh. Hari Krishnaji Shastri and Shrimati Vibha Shastri were the Chief Guests. The function was largely attended.

During the year under review, the Association received spontaneous support from many kind hearted persons. Shri Sunder T. Vachani, Managing Director, Weston Electronics Ltd. presented us with a T.V. set. Shrimati Rama Singh, Trustee, I.C. Trust, Delhi presented us a large selection of books worth more than a thousand rupees. Sardar Daljit Singh has been providing us with his famous brands of soft drinks, on every occasion of importance for the last so many years. Shri Ravi Dubey, General Manager, Taj mahal Hotel, New Delhi gave us hundreds of packets of tasty snacks in 1985 and again for the present Annual Day. Other advertisers and donors have responded magnificently.

Lala Bansi Dharji, Chairman, DCM Limited has evinced a keen interest in our activities and assured us of his positive involvement in our activities. This will, we are sure, prove a turning point in our history

Yet another significant development of the year, is the successful settlement of our land case that had been hanging fire these Six years and more. For this we owe a debt of gratitude to Shri Shastriji who took up the case on our behalf and Shri H.L. Kapur, Lt. Governor, Delhi, the latter passed appropriate orders. The Association will now get land in Hauz Khas Institutional area in lieu of plot earlier allotted in Masjid Moth. We will now be able to take up for implementation our dream project—an integrated rehabilitation centre for the deaf.

The Association has also been trying its best to obtain social justice for the deaf community as a whole. Earlier, all categories of disabled enjoyed equal facilities and concessions. This non-discriminatory treatment ended when several concessions were given to orthopaedically disabled and blind but denied to the deaf-mutes. Now by providing 50 percent fare concessions to the deaf-mutes, the Railways have undone a part of injustice to which deaf-mutes were subjected. But the discrimination in several other spheres persists for instance total deaf but who can speak a little have been denied railway concession without any rhyme or reason. Our endeavour will remain to obtain equal concessions and facilities for all categories of the disabled persons including the deaf.

We have also been in correspondence with various Ministries and Departments of the Government of India for various matters that vitally affect the deaf. Filling up of the reserved post proportionally with different categories of the disabled, identification of posts where disabled may work without adversely affecting efficiency, opening of more educational institution etc. can be mentioned in this context. Though we are doing our best the response from the authorities has been rather luke-warm.

We have now fully realised that we cannot live in isolation and must inter-act with organisations of the deaf in other parts of the country and a number of positive steps have been taken.

We have also decided that training be provided to the desirous members in type writing, T.V. Radio assembly, screen printing at our existing office and steps are being taken to introduce these courses within the next few days. Training in a few other selected trades will be introduced within the next few months.

To implement these various schemes and also to secure our legitimate rights presently denied to us, we need your material and moral support.

I would request Shri Tyterji to take some interest in the rehabilitation of our members, a large number of whom are his constituents. Their services can be utilised in Hotel Corporation of India in diverse capacities. Also, the fare concession on air travel, presently admissible to blind only needs to be extended to all categories of disabled persons for the sake of uniformity, also natural justice and to end discrimination.

I am a humble person. I have been interacting with the deaf-mutes for the last several years and have come to know their problems, also hopes and aspirations. However being an ordinary person, I can not help them much either to solve their problems or to realise their hopes and aspirations. Still I do my humblest.

Since I can understand their gestures and also express myself modestly through signs, I often act as their interpreter. When they need advice, I readily give it even though I am not a sagacious person. But for these people every bit helps.

It is one of my self imposed tasks to act as the Receptionist/Enquiry Officer for the Association. Since all the members and staff are deaf mutes, they can not attend phone it becomes my duty to receive all calls, interpret the message and convey a reply.

Often various enquiries are received on phone. As I know most of the facts relating to the Association, I am able to answer such queries. When parents of the deaf seek advice about admission in school/training institute, I am able to provide the same as I am aware of these things.

Of course all this is not much but as I said I am a humble person but I try to do my best

I am genuinely fond of my deaf-mute friends. They find in me a good listener and so unburden themselves before me. Then they feel relaxed. This is in itself a social service and leads to their social adjustment. Also, my friends trust me and are satisfied that their thoughts will remain safe with me and not become matter of common knowledge.

Sometimes, I am required to deal with Government officials too on behalf of my deaf-mute friends. It is rather difficult to convince the unfamiliar that deaf-mutes are quite rational, logical and have the same thought process, also feelings of hurt or joy but I succeed in removing most of their doubts and prejudices.

I would like to do more for these silent children of God but I have my own limitations and, therefore, desire not-with-standing, I find myself quite helpless. I am however, trying to increase my involvement in their activities and hope to be of greater service to them.

Of one thing I am however, sure. I will continue to do my best, selflessly and devotedly for the good of my deaf-mute friends. I have fully identified myself with their hopes and aspirations. May God help me. —AMEN
