

## *Hony. Secretary's Report*

—D.S. CHAUHAN

Esteemed Shri Shastriji, Distinguished Guests And Friends,

I have the pleasure of presenting our Annual Report for the year 1987-88.

During the year under review, we were able to take possession of the plot allotted to us by Delhi Development Authority in Institutional Area, South of I.I.T. New Delhi. The issue that was pending since 1981 was thus finally settled for which we are indebted to Shri Hari Krishna Shastri, our Chairman and Shri H.L. Kapur, Lt. Governor, Delhi both of whom took personal interest in this case. Since the plot was less than our entitlement of 1000 sq. yds. we were hesitant to accept it. However, the Members in the New Year's Get-together had opted for this plot due to its central location. Accordingly, the possession was taken on January 8, 1988. This was one of our major achievements.

Following successful settlement of the land case, we approached M/s Bharadwaj, Bharadwaj & Associates, the noted Architect and Consultancy firm to provide professional services to our building project. They have very kindly agreed to do so and earned our grateful thanks.

Our pending accounts have also been completed, brought upto date and audited. This has been possible due to the support and assistance lent to us by our Hony. Auditors, M/s. Sood & Co. The accounts have also been audited by the Examiner, Local Funds Accounts of Delhi Administration. As a result of finalisation of accounts, we have been able to file Income Tax Returns as also seek exemption from Income Tax under Section 80G of Income Tax Act.

On behalf of our Association, our Chairman, Shri Hari Krishna Shastri has been regularly writing to the various Union Ministries on issues affecting the welfare of the Deaf and some favourable policy decisions have since been taken. The Government launched a drive to clear the back log in filling up the posts reserved for the Deaf in Central Govt. offices and a large number of our members were able to get C&D category posts. We have also been in regular correspondence with the Directorate of Social Welfare, Delhi Administration, Special Employment Exchange for Physically Handicapped and Vocational Rehabilitation Centre for Physically Handicapped. The Association sent several delegations to meet top civic officers including Commissioner, Municipal Corporation of Delhi and Vice Chairman, Delhi Development Authority to discuss matters affecting the interests of the deaf as also to take up individual cases of the members. Though not much could be accomplished, the efforts are continuing.

Our Reading Room and Library services were further augmented and we started lending magazines and periodicals etc. for home study as well. This has evoked good response. The Association organised several functions. A largely attended Seminar was held at India International Centre. Independence Day picnic was held on August 15, 1987. New Year's get together was held on January 3, 1988 at Nehru Park, New Delhi. All these functions were largely attended.

In February, 1988, more than 30 members of the Association went on an educational tour of South India. They visited Madras, Ramēswaram, Madurai, Kanyakumari, Cochin, Tirupati etc. and also participated in the 3rd Tamil Nadu State Conference of the Deaf held at Kanya-Kumari. The Hony. Secretary was invited to attend Seminar organised by Ali Yavar Jung National Institute for Hearing Handicapped in September, 1987 and was later nominated an Advisor on Sign Language. The Association extended fraternal assistance to Jaipur Badhir Sanstha and Faridabad Badhir Sangh and helped these get themselves registered under the Societies Registration Act. Similar requests for help are being recieved from other stations also but resources constraints and paucity of personnel prevented the Association from extending the desired assistance

New members have been joining the Association in larger numbers. The membership has now crossed the 600 mark. As a result the Association has to cater to the needs of larger numbers and the absence of a regular full time staff is being acutely felt. It is proposed to recruit requisite staff and persuade Directorate of Social Welfare, Delhi Administration to sanction grant-in-aid for meeting expenditure on this score.

The Association continued to provide recreational facilities to its members. It also sent Delhi State contingents for participation in various national level sports events and successfully organised 16th Delhi Games of the Deaf in Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, New Delhi on February 7, 1988. Several hundred deaf athlets participated in these games. The Association incurred an expenditure of about Rs.18,000/-during the year on sports promotion among the deaf and yet instead of receiving any grant-in-aid was forced to refund the earlier grant-in aid of Rs. 29,000/, even though it stood fully utilised. The matter is pending with Delhi Administration and is likely to be sorted out soon. Here, it would be pertinent to stress that grant-in-aid should be released before the expiry of an accounting year and not re-imbursed after the amount has been actually spent as in the absence of requisite funds before hand, sports activities suffer and funds have to be transferred from other accounts creating difficulties.

During the year, the Association suffered a grievous loss in the sad and untimely death of Shri Bimal Behari Mathur, its Hony. Sports Secretary who died on the cricket pitch while bowling. He was one of the most active and popular office bearers. The void created by his passing away will be difficult to fill up. Our Chairman, promptly took up the case for employment of Shri Mathur's widow in his office on compassionate grounds and positive results are expected.

As regards our future plans, the building project has the over-riding priority. At least one phase of the building has to be completed within two years of taking over the possession i.e. by January 1990. To accomplish this herculean task we need help and assistance from all quarters as our own resources are limited.


We also propose to start evening classes for the members preparing for X Class examination of Open School and impart training to those selected for C category posts recently so that they may be able to give a good account of themselves. The Reading Room Cum-Library facilities will be further augmented. Infra-structures for coaching in various disciplines of sports are also being created. Subject to availability of suitable premises, a nursery/primary school for the deaf is also proposed to be started. Rehabilitation activities are being strengthened by engaging full time staff. An educational tour of Nepal is also on the cards. Another batch will be sent on educational tour of South India later in the year. Several other proposals are in the pipe-line and given the support of our patrons implemented in due course. Various policy cases will be continued to be pursued with Central Govt. These include

uniformity of concessions and facilities for all categories of handicapped by removing existing disparities like that in air and railway fare concession, special conveyance allowances to handicapped Govt. employees and legislative measures to protect the interests of the Deaf. We would also stress replacing News Magazine for Hearing Impaired on T.V. by a programme on sign language for the benefit of all including normal persons to end isolation of the Deaf by familiarising others with sign language



In India, 43% of female deaths are related to pregnancy and child birth in the age group 15-24 years. Out of 40.50 lakh marriages in India, every year, 30 lakhs are of girls who are minors—between 15 and 18 years.

Marriage and pregnancy are very dangerous for adolescent girls. Because of poor health, inadequate medical care and nutrition, the risk to a teenage mother and her child is greater. A young mother in her teens has not reached maturity physically, mentally and psychologically.

Early marriage and child birth also lead to high infant mortality—47% of all childhood deaths in India occur below the age of 5 years.

Even among adult females 25% of all deaths are due to child birth and pregnancy. Over 60% of Indian women of child bearing age are anaemic.

Raising the age of marriage for both girls and boys would help them to achieve full physical growth. After marriage the spacing of children enhances the life expectancy of both mother and child.

To build a happy and healthy family:

- Take special care of children—through GOBI:

G = GROWTH MONITORING

O = ORAL REHYDRATION

B = BREAST FEEDING

I = IMMUNISATION

- Marry late—girls after 18 and boys after 21.
- Plan your family—to improve the quality of family life.
- Educate girls and boys, women and men, equally.





**MAN CAN'T CREATE WATER: WHY SHOULD HE WASTE IT ?**

**Since Time Began  
Water And Life Have Been Synonymous**

**Leaks Cause Losses**

**1. Water: Nature's Wonder Wasted**

—There are over 7 lakh domestic water connections in Delhi and if each house on average has 2 taps, this would mean 14 lakh taps. Even if only 10 per cent of these drip slowly, it would mean over 1 lakh leaking taps. Now a slowly dripping tap wastes about 4 gallons a day, which means a loss of over 5 lakh gallons of valuable water every day. Therefore, the leakage should be mended immediately. And the remedy is so simple. An inexpensive fresh washer is usually enough to stop the leak.

**2. Close the Tap When Away**

—When you open the tap and there is no water, it is a human tendency to let the dry tap remain open. But the water will come, maybe later. So imagine how much water would be wasted between the time it remains open and when you return home to close it.

**3. Public Hydrants**

—There are about 8,000 public hydrants for the use of general public. Often many taps are removed by mischievous persons. Local residents are requested to be vigilant and report any tampering with taps on the telephone numbers listed below.

**4. Leaks Outside House**

—Leaks outside the house are easier to ignore since they don't mess up the floor or keep you awake at night. However, they can be even more wasteful than inside leaks. And if they occur on your main water line, the wastage of water will be colossal.

**5. Where to Report**

—In case you notice any leakage in the water mains, fittings and public water hydrants, as a good citizen, please inform the Control Centres in the various Zones. The telephone numbers of the Centres are :-


