

CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

"BREAK THE COMMUNICATION BARRIERS"

Dear Members,

My message to you on our 41st Annual Day is "Break the Communication Barriers; Come Out of Your Shells".

You must have heard of Dr. (Miss) Helen Keller. She was blind, deaf and dumb. Since birth. And yet, through super-human efforts, she over-came her multiple disabilities and became a beacon of light and hope for the disabled persons all over the World.

Her autobiography is very interesting. She confesses that she was a spoilt child. In her dark, silent world, she led a lonely miserable existence. That is, till she broke the communication barriers and came out of her shell. Her example should

encourage and enthuse all those who wish to overcome their inherent disabilities. Bigger the challenge, greater the victory.

There is a very interesting aspect to Helen Keller's autobiography. When asked which one of the three faculties of speech, hearing, and sight she would choose if given a boon, she had unhesitatingly opted for the sense of hearing. Asked to explain her choice, she had replied that it was deafness that cut off the afflicted person from the Society. She had added that in a society where thought, ideas and intentions were expressed through the spoken word, not to be able to hear was the ultimate in misery.

To revert to the theme of my message, I urge the members to break the communication barriers. This may be an uphill task, but it can be accomplished with will and determination. Study language, any language and acquire working command over it. It will then be possible to express thoughts and ideas correctly.

For those who are not literate, the solution lies in sophistication and popularisation of sign language. If easy to understand signs are standardised and then propagated through the electronic mass media like T.V., these barriers that segregated deaf from the rest of the society can be easily broken.

Isolation, some times self-imposed, has to be ended. It is necessary to come out of the shell and inter-act with other human beings.

Another point that I wish to make is that the deaf should try to become economically independent. This can be done by acquiring special skills in areas where your handicap is an advantage. Seek and identify such areas and then work to acquire the necessary skills. There is the engineering industry, the textile industry and many other such industries where noise levels are high. Use the immunity you have from noise pollution to master these trades.

I would conclude by addressing a few words to my fellow industrialists and community leaders. Indian ethos teaches us that service of our fellow beings is the highest form of worship. Mahatma Gandhi lived by this precept. Swami Viveka nanda was willing to forgo Moksha and be born again and again if given an opportunity to serve his fellow beings. Therefore, in keeping with this tradition, I appeal to all of you to espouse this cause.

इसी बीच सभा ने टंकण प्रशिक्षण देना प्रारम्भ कर दिया है। छः टंकण मशीनें उपलब्ध की गई हैं। इनमें बिजली से चलने वाले उपकरण भी हैं। इन का प्रयोग बधिर बिना भेद भाव के निःशुल्क कर रहे हैं। संध्या कालीन कक्षाएं भी प्रारम्भ कर दी गई हैं। स्टाफ सलेक्शन कमीशन की परीक्षा देने वालों को भी प्रशिक्षण दिया जाता है। स्थान की कमी को देखते हुए सभा के लिए इतना सब कुछ करना व अपने सदस्यों के नाना प्रकार के मामलों में पत्र व्यवहार आदि की सुविधा प्रदान कराना वस्तुतः अच्छी उपलब्धियां हैं।

साथ ही सभा खेल कूदों को भी प्रोत्साहन देती रही है। समय-समय पर तरह-तरह के आयोजन किये जाते हैं जिनसे समाज को बधिरों की वस्तुस्थिति व योग्यता का पता चलता है।

मुझे प्रसन्नता है कि ऐसी सेवा भावी संस्था से मैं सम्बन्धित हूँ और इसके माध्यम से अपने बहरे भाई बहनों की किंचित सेवा करने का सुअवसर प्राप्त कर सकता हूँ। मेरी भविष्य में चेष्टा होगी कि सभा और इसके सदस्यों की अधिकाधिक सेवा करूँ।

Forty First Annual Report for the year 1990—1991

D.S. CHAUHAN

It is my privilege to submit the Association's Forty First Annual Report. The year has proved to be an eventful one for the Association as well as the nation.

Fortieth Anniversary

The Association celebrated its Fortieth Anniversary on July 8, 1990 at India International Centre New Delhi. It was a largely attended affair. Several well wishers of the Association joined members on the occasion. The celebration was a success.

Election of office Bearers :

The election of office bearers for the year 1990-91 was held on 26.8.1990. All the office bearers were elected unanimously once again.

The Association was fortunate enough to enlist active participation of Dr. Bansi Dhar, one of the country's top industrialists and Shri Rajendra Kumar Gupta, also an important industrialist and public figure (Ex-Mayor of Delhi) as Chairman and Vice Chairman, respectively. Dr. Surya Prakash N. Puri, Ex. Member of Lok Sabha and a well known educationalist became Association's Advisor. With such inspiring leadership, the Association was able to take big strides.

Activities : (Rehabilitational Assistance)

The Association was able to provide rehabilitational assistance to a large number of deaf. On an average 15-16 deaf visit office daily in connection with their personal cases. The Association interprets their signs drafts applications, and takes up their cases with different authorities.

The Association sponsored candidature of a large number of deaf for training/placement. Encouraging results were obtained.

Reading Room :

The Association continued to provide Reading Room Services to its Members. Numerous periodicals and a few national newspapers were subscribed to and provided to members to keep them informed of the latest developments in India and abroad. Periodicals were also lent for home reading.

Library :

The Association continued to operate Library for the benefit of members. Books valued at about Rs. 4000/- were added. Some more books were also received by way of donation. Library is now being given formal set-up. Membership Cards/lending cards etc. have been introduced.

Training :

As a part of its fortieth Anniversary Celebrations, the Association introduced type writing (English) training. Five type writers have been provided and boys are receiving training in groups, in batches of four-five, two hours at a time.

An electronic type-writer, courtesy State Bank of India has also been arranged exclusively for training purpose. Shri Narendra Sinha, Joint Secretary, has undergone training and is now training other members.

Recreation :

The Association has been providing recreational facilities, indoor games etc. It also has a T.V. and organises outings etc.

Functions :

The Association organised several functions to create awareness about the deaf. Its Independence Day picnic held annually in Lodhi Gardens, this year attracted participation of over 600 persons; a record.

Membership :

During the year under review a record number of 98 Life members were enrolled. The total life membership now stands at 542. There are a large number of members who pay fee of Rs. 12/- per annum.

Sports & Games :

The Association sent the Delhi State contingent drawn up from among members of the Association and students of Govt. Lady Noyce Sec. School for the Deaf and Balwant Rai Mehta Vidya Bhawan, Masjid Moth, New Delhi to participate in the 13th National Games of the Deaf held at Nagpur from 27.12.90 to 31.12.90. As many as 64 deaf athletes and officials participated. The State won Two gold, Two silver and Four bronze medals,

✓ 19th Delhi Games of the Deaf were held on 20.1.91 at Jawahar Lal Nehru Stadium. A record number of 300 participants, drawn from half a dozen institutions of the deaf participated. Dr. Bansidhar, Chairman, D.C.M, Shriram Industries Ltd., who is also the Chairman of Association inaugurated the Games and Shri Madan Lal Khurana M.P. was the Chief Guest at the concluding ceremony. Smt. Khurana gave away the prizes. A number of meet records were established,

Grants :

The Association was able to obtain grant-in-aid of Rs. 59795/- from Directorate of Education (Sports Branch), Delhi Administration, Delhi for sports promotion for the year 1990-91. As usual the amount was released after the closure of the financial year.

Another amount of Rs. 10,000/- was received from the Municipal Corporation of Delhi for welfare work. This too was released after the closure of the financial year. The Association places on record its appreciation for the grant sanctioning authorities and hopes that in future the amounts would be released in time.

Donations :

The Association was privileged to receive financial support from its patrons, some of whom like Hindustan Petroleum Corporation, Kwality Ice cream Co., Wig Construction Co., Asian Hotels Ltd, All India Deaf & Dumb Society etc. have been contributing to the Association's Building Fund year after. The Association places on record its indebtedness to all the donors.

The Association upon being registered for Foreign Contribution, secured donations in Foreign Currency. Among these donors in Foreign currency was Dr. (Mrs) Anita Kaul Bansal (US 100 dollars) daughter of our Executive President Shri B.N. Kaul and Mr. Ganesh Tawakley (200 DM) a life member of the Association, settled in Germany. H.E. Mr. Helmert, a top official of E.E.C. who earlier headed E.E.C's office in India, contributed 40 US Dollars and assured larger assistance in future. The Association's grateful to the above.

In some instances, the Association could not make any headway. Its building plans are still pending with DDA. Recently, a delegation headed by our Vice Chairman, Shri Rajendra Kumar Gupta and including Shri D. Bharadwaj, our Hony. Architect waited on the Vice Chairman, DDA, explained the position and requested for early settlement of pending issues. It is now hoped that matter will finally be settled in favour of Association.

The Association's case filed with the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi challenging election of the office bearers of the All India Federation of the Deaf (AIFD) has also been pending without any positive results, largely because of the refusal of AIFD to receive summons from the Court. Out of four years term of office bearers, 3 years have already gone by during which these office bearers elected in a highly irregular manner continued to enjoy power and perks of office, even though they have no claim. We are hopeful that even if late, truth shall prevail and justice shall be done to our cause.

Another and perhaps more serious failure has been our inability to convince Directorate of Social welfare, Delhi Administration, that we are serving the best interests of the deaf. That office has passed an onesided summary fiat that the Association is not doing any welfare work. This conclusion has been arrived at on the ground that Association does not have full time paid staff. Our plea that Hony. Secretary works 10 hours a day and has the support of a large number of educated deaf who work daily for a fixed duration has had no effect. All this because in the true tradition of social workers, all of us work for free, not for any monetary consideration. Others, in similar circumstances, claim Honorariums running into several thousands per month. Such worthies are deemed to be eligible for grant-in-aid where as self-less service of our fellow sufferers has no value in the eyes of these buracrates. This is a pity for we need real social workers and can only have them if we encourage rather than discourage such a rare breed. Our request is please do not make the social workers money minded. Let us hope light may dawn on the official dom. On our part we shall continue to work for free, recognition or no-recognition.

Future Prajections :

Our Building Project gets top priority. We are hopeful that building plans will be cleared soon and the Association will be able to get the Foundation stone laid in October 1991. Simultaneously, a three day National Convention of the Deaf is purposed to be called.

The Association also has plans to introduce training in desk top printing, reprography, spiral binding, lesser type-setting etc. These advanced technologies have been chosen because of consideration for space.


Library and reading room service are being augmented. It is expected that another 150-200 Life members will be added during the year and the membership would touch the four figure mark making the Association the largest organisation of the Adult Deaf in the world.

Evening classes, as also classes for secretarial practices and computer training have also been planned. Through the courtesy of our Chairman, space has already been arranged. Services of teachers are being enlisted and once these are available, these projects will be implemented.

Several other projects are in pipeline-particularly, those concerned with Sports promotion and recreation. These include intensive coaching programmes in different disciplines in athletics and games. Bharat Darshan for members and a Holiday Camp at one of the Hill Stations is also on the cards.

By the grace of God and through the support of our patrons and well wishers, we hope to implement all these and many more such welfare projects during the coming days.

SHRI P.N. GUPTA



A person of sterling qualities and incomparable in integrity, the late Shri P N. Gupta was a fine example of a dedicated social worker. He was totally committed to the cause of the Association and devoted time, energy and resources to advance its cause. Still in the prime of his life, he fell victim to a road accident.


Born deaf, he was educated at Govt. Lady Noyce School for the Deaf. After passing fourth class, he was picked up for training in gasket making by an Englishman, who personally trained him in handling various sophisticated machines.

After completion of his training, he joined Payen Talbros (P) Lrd. and but for a short break remained with the Company, serving it loyally and devotedly.

One of the most knowledgeable persons about sports, he had been Organising Delhi Games of the Deaf annually for the last quarter of a century. He led Delhi State Contingents to various National Sports Meets of the Deaf as Chief-de-Mission and was always busy chalking out ways and means to promote sports and games among the deaf.

Even though a bit strict in enforcing discipline, he had a heart of gold. In his death the Association has lost one of its strongest pillars, and dynamic members.

SHRI NARENDRA SINHA



The fraternity of deaf in India were deprived of a youthful, totally dedicated and hard working servant at the cruel hands of death

Shri Narendra Sinha was an experienced, charming and matured person. He was also one of the best educated among the deaf and in popularity, he had no equals. He was universally liked. He had many friends, but no foe.

Born deaf, yet he learnt to speak. He studied with deaf at the school for deaf and then joined school for normal children. He was one of the rare few to have graduated inspite of his deafness.

Gentle to a fault, he was totally devoted to the Association. He won his first election as member of Executive Committee in 1985 with the highest votes and had been an office bearer ever since.

Narendra Sinha was initially employed in a private organisation. He subsequently joined Gas Authority of India as Jr. Assistant. There too, he won a large circle of friends due to his gentle manners and good behaviour.

He worked selflessly for the Association, even till late hours in the night and did not accept any remuneration for his labours. He was self-effacing, simple and unassuming. If he unwittingly gave offence to any one, he readily apologized.

Such was our friend late Shri Narendra Sinha and in his death, we have lost our steady friend and a loyal, loving brother.
